A DOCTOR IN DANGER

“DR. LIVINGSTONE, I PRESUME?”**

DO YOU KNOW WHAT IT MEANS?

David Livingstone was a Scottish doctor, born in 1813, who spent more than 30 years of his life walking around Africa telling people about the Lord Jesus Christ. But he didn't JUST walk and talk; he drew pictures of the rivers, mountains and villages so the NEXT person who walked through the jungle would know what was there. His maps and diagrams helped the ENTIRE world.

But not everyone liked Dr. Livingstone. One sad day, some people (he thought they were his friends, but obviously they weren't) took everything he owned (including his medicine bag) and deserted him in the middle of nowhere. His “friends” then reported him dead. Dr. Livingstone tried to keep going, but he grew weaker and weaker. For 80 days, he laid in a hut wishing he had the strength to go home.

Meanwhile people around the world were wondering if Livingstone had REALLY died. (Remember, he was famous by this time because of all those maps.) The *New York Herald* sent out a search party led by Henry M. Stanley. Stanley's search is a story in itself. He had to travel many miles and question a lot of people. Finally, after a long search, he found his man. That's when he said, “Dr. Livingstone, I presume?”

But instead of going home with Mr. Stanley, Dr. Livingstone stayed in Africa to preach the gospel. People who have studied his life say he walked over 29,000 miles

(46,671 km) through Africa as he preached God's Word and drew maps of the land.

As a missionary, Dr. Livingstone led many people to Christ — and through his maps, diagrams and books, he inspired many others to become missionaries in Africa.

Is the Lord calling YOU to be a missionary? You're NOT too young to pray about your future. You're NOT too young to tell the Lord you're willing to go where He wants you to go and do what He wants you to do.

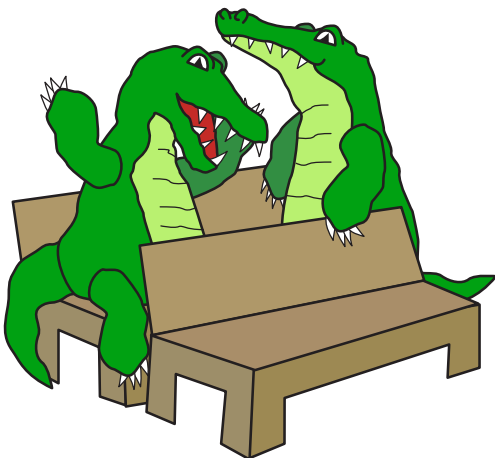
